Two years off with the pandemic, that's wheear, Alas and alack!

What an awful time it has been for everybody. Behaviours have had to be curtailed: normal lifestyles have had to be put on the back burner; nothing we have gone through could have prepared us for what happened.

We've missed two Bed Races, the 2020 and 2021 incarnations. The need for social distancing, self-isolation and mask wearing made the cancellations inevitable.

But nothing quite stopped in and around Knaresborough. Not even for a minute. What was most inspiring were all the ordinary folk, working on their own or through voluntary organisations, who did not sit back behind the rules. They went out and did their bit. More than their bits. Beyond and above the call of duty in most cases. Their first thought was to see what they could do for those less fortunate.

At the start of the pandemic a new community organisation, Knaresborough Connectors, was formed to lead on the response for those in need, individuals and families. The many people who were badly affected by losing jobs, by being isolated and being cut off from loved ones. And for the great many who couldn't even step out to enjoy some fresh air.

Connectors gave great leadership, and will hopefully run for many years to come. Many other social groups and individuals plugged into their arrangements to help. We are very pleased that our Lions club gave them assistance wherever we could. We helped keep in touch with those isolating. We made deliveries and did their shopping. We provided reassurance and linked with families who were living miles from Knaresborough and had their own issues. And we organised days out whenever the restrictions were lifted. Lions also assisted at the vaccination centres in Harrogate and Knaresborough.

Those of us who live in town and in the surrounding areas know how lucky we are to be here. There is such a strong sense of community in this part of the world.

There were others involved too: scouts, guides, air cadets, the library, sports groups and official bodies such as the councils and individual councillors, police, NHS, the schools and others. We apologise for any we have failed to mention. If we have forgotten, let us know and we'll put you in next year's Bed Race programme!

Then there were the very many businesses who lent a very important hand too. Just as an example, one was the Zolsha restaurant on the High Street. The owner Jav, and his team contacted us offering free meals for those in need. We linked this offer with the staff at King James's School to identify those who could do with a little help. Meals were offered free for collection on Wednesdays and for those who couldn't go themselves, we Lions took food to their doors.

The pandemic proved what many of us suspected: that Knaresborough is a magic place where folk drop what they are doing to help their neighbours.

We also know this was a pattern that was repeated right across the country. People are good at heart and will instinctively rise up to help where they can - especially where they are allowed to. Hopefully this same story will be true of the aid offered to Ukraine and Ukrainians.

And now we are back with Bed Race for 2022. Fit and raring to go. The landscape has changed a bit. There is no Stray FM, which was closed early in the pandemic, but we have the new radio service Your Harrogate as our 2022 media partner. Many thanks to them for all they will do on Bed Race day in keeping people informed of what is going on and how the events of the day will unfold.

Many thanks to the teams for stepping forward again for one of the world's most iconic sporting spectacles. On behalf of the Lions many thanks to all our helpers. And many thanks to you, too, for coming to Bed Race and reading this programme.





BED RACE RULES



THE TEAM

- Each team **MUST** provide the name and contact details of two adult (18-years or above) marshals at the time of their application to take part in the Bed Race. It is a requirement of entry on the day that each team's marshals (who must have attended a marshal brief), report to the marshal reception point in the Castle Grounds by 1200-hrs. Failure to do so will lead to disqualification.
- The bed and runners must be decorated to the published theme of the year. Failure to do so leads to disqualification.
- The bed and team will take part in the parade and must follow the requests at all times of the marshals and race officials.
- The **running team** [both adult and junior] will be made up of either 6 males, or 6 females, or a mixed team of 3 male and 3 female, plus one passenger. Non-standard mixed teams will be regarded as male.
- A junior team must be in years 8 to 11 inclusive of the school year to qualify for entry.
- The **passenger** must be no younger than 10 years old (Year 6) and all passengers must wear protective headgear and lifejackets throughout the race.
- No substitutions will be allowed during the
- Riding on the bed except for the passenger is forbidden.
- All competitors must be able to swim. During the race all beds must keep to the left unless overtaking or at request of race
- officials. The throwing of objects/liquids is extremely dangerous and is strictly forbidden. Failure to comply leads to disqualification.
- No alcohol to be consumed by the team runners until after the race has ended. Any team found to be under the influence of alcohol will be disqualified and banned from future races.

- The team must be able to complete the course within 30 minutes. Please ensure you are able to do so before the race on the day.
- Bed race is a family event, all members of the team and parade must conduct themselves appropriately at all times ie no swearing, no inappropriate gestures. The organisers reserve the right to withdraw a team at any point.
- Each team must have a named Captain who takes responsibility for ensuring the safety of the team during the race and the parade.
- To enter for the Fastest New Team, no team member must have completed in a previous bed race.
- To qualify for the non-club competition, no team member can belong to an England Athletics-affiliated club.
 - All Teams are to complete a Team Detail Sheet to show any change from the Original Entry Form. This is to have signed parental consent for ALL runners and passengers aged 16 or under. The Detail Sheet will be issued in the team pack at the team brief and must be handed in to the scrutineers on the day. If your team changes category from your original entry form due to changes in runners, you must inform the organisers at least 48 hours before the start of the race; otherwise you will not be eligible for a category prize.
 - The provided wrist bands must be worn by all team members and the two helpers throughout the day. Only the team and two helpers will be allowed into the race start point at Conyngham Hall.
- At least one member of the team must attend the team briefing and collect the team pack. Any trophies won during previous year's event must be returned at or before the team briefing.



BED RACE RULES



THE BED

- - Each team **must** provide:
 - A bed decorated in the theme for the year
 - An audible air horn / hooter
 - A helmet for the passenger
 - A lifejacket for the passenger
- When decorated, the bed must not exceed 2 metres in width, 4 metres in length and 3 metres in height.
- Decorations must be removed from the bed before the start of the Race
- The bed must have no means of mechanical propulsion.
- All beds must have been examined and passed by the scrutineers prior to the start of the Race.
- The Bed numbers **must** be attached to the Float prior to the Parade and reused for the race. Five race numbers must be displayed, one on the front of the Bed and one on each side of the bed and one on each side of the passenger's helmet. It is the team captain's responsibility to ensure that these numbers stay attached until after the Race element and crossing the finish line.



- Fach bed **must** have a built-in buoyancy aid capable of supporting the bed and the passenger for not less than five minutes and have an aperture large enough to allow the passenger to escape quickly if required.
- Each bed must:
 - i) Have four wheels of **not more** than 260mm in diameter including tyres, and a minimum tyre width of 55mm.
 - ii) Allow a gauge of 150mm by 450mm wide to pass under the bed in the direction of travel (i.e. ground clearance of 150mm and the wheels must be at least 450mm apart, side to side).
 - iii) Allow a gauge of 150mm by1250mm long to pass under the bed at 90 degrees to the direction of travel (i.e. ground clearance of 150mm and the wheels must be at least 1250mm apart, front to rear).
 - iv) Have a minimum length of 1750mm and a minimum width of 750mm
 - v) Have a maximum length of 3.0m and a maximum width of 1.35m.
 - vi) Two ropes, not more than 3.5 metres in length, may be attached to the front of the Bed. These must not be secured to any member of the Team. No ropes are to be attached to the rear of the bed. Ropes must not include loops or knots along any part of their length or at the non-bed end/s. Beds may be inspected more than once so please do not tie loops or knots after original scrutineering.

OUR TWIN TOWN



The Twinning of Knaresborough and the German town of Bebra has been called 'a kind of marriage', so well suited are the two locations and so keen the participants to making it work.

The marriage was originally an arranged wedding, with the Council of European Communities acting as matchmaker. The first move was made by Bebrans (being folk of Bebra) and a twinning agreement was signed in Bebra in 1969, followed a year later in Knaresborough by a ratification of the deal.

So this year is our 52nd anniversary. It would have our golden wedding in 2020 but, like all things, it was sacrificed for covid. What has characterised the marriage over the years is less the protocol of official visits by civic dignitaries, but more the very frequent contact by the people of both towns; people coming here and us going to Germany staying in each other's homes.

In the past we have seen exchanges between the football teams of each town - thankfully, few matches have been decided on penalties.

Since 1974 there have been visits every alternate year between the scholars of King James's School and Bruder Grimm Schule. In 2019, there was a large celebration at King James's School held to mark 45 years of learning together.



Over the years, Bebrans have timed their official visits to coincide with the Great Knaresborough Bed Race and we will host many visitors this year. Bebran teams have regularly entered the race and on one famous occasion they even set a new course record. A little while ago, the Bebra squad competed in the event after having cycled all

> the way across Germany and from the ferry port in Hull, arriving with just one day's rest prior to the big day!

> We will have Bebrans in town at this year's Bed Race and will continue to welcome them for many years to come.



Perhaps the most enduring of the relationships is that between the Knaresborough Silver Band and TSV Musikzug, and a celebration is being held this year in Bebra to mark 40 years of making music together.

BED RACE IN THE NEWS



If you are thinking what constitutes the perfect town, then Knaresborough has to be on the list. BBC presenter, Steve Brown, is clearly of the view that, with its scenic views, old-world charm and easy lifestyle, our home town has much to recommended it - and then there's Bed Race!

Knaresborough and Bed Race featured in the first episode of Escape to the Perfect Town, which was aired on BBC, and repeated several times since. In the way of these things, it could be doing the rounds for years to come.

Steve undertook to help a couple relocating from London to find suitable housing in the area. While he did so, a platform was created to show what Knaresborough is all about - great community spirit and plenty of green spaces. They also featured footage from the 2019 Bed Race. Stray Birds, one of that year's teams, were interviewed and Steve had the chance to ride on their bed and made cracking television.

Earlier this year, a website listed its favourite 'Ten Quirky Competitions that Actually Exist'. In fourth place was Bed Race, located after 'Extreme Ironing' and 'Chess Boxing', but ahead of 'Ugliest Dog' and the seminal 'Toilet Paper Wedding Dress Contest'. Who could argue with that! See more on: Ten Quirky Competitions That Actually Exist -Listverse

Writing on the news portal Yorkshire Live, Charles Gray wrote about 'How the Great Knaresborough Bed Race became a worldwide phenomenon'. He described how Knaresborough's organisers had helped people in towns around the globe set up their own bed races - from Auckland, Florida, South Africa, Western Australia and elsewhere in Britain. International recognition, he added, is helped by press coverage with national media a constant and screen time being given in places like Brazil and Spain.

In terms of UK national media, the Daily Telegraph and Daily Express have both published recent articles about the event. The Telegraph's headline talked about Knaresborough's 'Gruesome Past and Strange Present' (meaning Bed Race). They described Bed Race Day as turning into a big party. which is an ... "atmospheric seque into the charms this little market town has to offer".

Digging around on-line another website stood out. The US Travel and Leisure site headed its story 'Why You Need to See this English Town's Annual Bed Race', making it an obligation - like Naples to do at least once in your life.

The holiday site *rove.me* wrote that Bed Race "is one of the most extraordinary and hilarious events in the UK'. Other coverage around Britain resulting from a Press Association story said that to take part in Bed Race you have to be "fit, fanatical and frankly a bit mad!". Now then, lad, don't take that too far.

Wendy Tapsell, who readers will remember as taking part as a passenger in the first two events, in 1966 and 1967, was featured in an article in Northern Life magazine. To read, go to: northernlifemagazine.co.uk/knaresborough-bedrace

Our most recent Bed Race, as you know, was in 2019 when the theme was 'Yorkshire'. One team dedicated their bed decoration to the Handsworth-born actor Sean Bean. It turns out there is a Sean Bean website which covered the news:www.seanbeanonline.net/forums/index.php ?topic=5611.0. In it he said he will have to get to Bed Race one day.




WATER OF LIFE

The last time we staged Bed Race was BC (Before Covid) on 8 June 2019, Nothing could be held for the next two years, of course, but the event three years ago gave us many memorable moments.

Then came the 2019 Great Knaresborough Bed Race itself. As expected, times were down on previous years, owing to the soggy conditions underfoot and the much higher river level. Nothing daunted G H Brooks Men came in first in 13 minutes 40 seconds. This was their second winner's trophy following on from their success in 2018.

Knaresborough Striders Men were second and Ripon Runners Men came third. Ripon Runners Girls won the Female cup, followed by Welly Wheelettes, who were also the fastest non-club female team. and Knaresborough Striders Ladies. Guardian Alarms were the fastest non-club men's team: Forest School were the fastest new team; Flying Pullman were the quickest mixed team and Ripon Fire





OAKS FOR BED RACE







The Royal Horticultural Society's garden centre at Harlow Carr has donated 100 young oak trees to the Lions to plant in commemoration of the Great Knaresborough Bed Race. The trees will be planted in the autumn of 2022 in Horseshoe Field, across the river from where Bed Race starts and finishes.

It is part of the huge Great Northern Forest project, which aims to see five million trees planted in a band from Liverpool to Hull. Reconstitution of the historic Forest of Knaresborough is a key element.

Lions are happy to be involved, says the club. It marks both the revival and regrowth of Bed Race after two years of cancellation due to the pandemic, and reflects the 'environmental' theme for 2022. It is hoped that the planting will preserve a lasting legacy of our great event.

Harlow Carr has been very kind with its offer. Itself a charity relying on the generosity of visitors, it has ridden to the aid of the Lions by providing the oak trees. The organisation is also helping to sponsor this year's Bed Race.

Very much part of the Yorkshire countryside, Harlow Carr is located on the western edge of Harrogate. It has been

part of the RHS since 2001 following the RHS merger with the Northern Horticultural Society, which had opened its botanical gardens at Harlow Carr in 1950. There are five RHS public gardens in the UK.

Located in what is described as a sweet, secluded spot. the 58-acre Harlow Carr site covers mixed woodland. pasture and arable land. The gardens feature the Montague-Burton Teaching Garden, Gardens Through Time and the Winter Walk. Other attractions are the Main Borders and the Annual Meadows featuring willow sculptures, and the recently-developed Alpine House and Bramall Learning Centre.

The centre is easily reached by road, but for those interested there is a lovely hour-long walk that leads up from Valley Gardens in Harrogate through the Pine Woods

Being in Knaresborough on Bed Race Day will give you lots of fantastic photo opportunities - and lasting memories. Even if you aren't running with a bed or marching in the wonderful Parade, there is lots to see and do during this fun-packed, highenergy event in our beautiful town.

Follow these tips to make the most of the day.

1. Plan your Journey

Roads start closing from 10.30am in the centre of town. The High Street, Bond End, High Bridge, Waterside, Knaresborough Hill and part of Boroughbridge Road are closed from 12.00pm. The road closure will be lifted at 6.00pm. Please check our website at www.bedrace.co.uk for up-to-date road closures on the day.

Parking is free at the Park and Ride facilities at Knaresborough Technology Park on Manse Lane and ALM on Grimbalds Crag. There will be a free bus service kindly operated by Transdev running from these car parks to Chapel Street in the Town Centre. Parking is banned along the route on race day.

There is a regular train service from Leeds, Harrogate and York as well as numerous buses to and from Harrogate.



2. Be Prepared

Check the weather forecast. Bed Race has seen many gloriously hot and sunny days, and also some very wet downpours. Pack extra layers, waterproofs and sun cream.

The day starts early with beds assembling in the Castle Grounds from 9am, so it can be long with a lot of walking. Comfortable shoes, then, are a must, with a few snacks and water coming in handy. Knaresborough stores, pubs and cafes will be well-stocked.

3. Have a map

Each programme has a map of the Bed Race course. Keep this with you to help navigation around the town for everything you need and the best places to watch the Parade and Race.

4. Conyngham Hall Field

This is the place to be following the Parade, as the Race starts and ends here. There will be a large LED screen where you can watch the Race unfold, and live entertainment on the Your Harrogate stage, children's entertainment, as well as bars and catering outlets.

5. Have Fun and Stay Safe

This is a really happy day in Knaresborough's calendar so please join in the fun and enjoy yourselves. There are numerous marshals along the route who have access to First Aiders, ambulance facilities and the police; please seek help if you need assistance.
